



Delta facility prepares women inmates for reentry Through job interview training

GREENWOOD – Thirty-six women in the MRI and Re-entry Academy Program at the Delta Correctional Facility now know what to expect during job interviews after they are released from prison.

Each incarcerated female participated in 30-60-minute mock interviews with three professional interviewers from outside the facility. The program addresses how many incarcerated individuals are released without the skills or confidence needed to successfully re-enter the workforce, contributing to recidivism rates.

"This event gave these women a taste of what a real-world hiring process feels like, boosting their confidence and equipping them with skills they will need as they work to reintegrate into society," said Delta's Program Director Rochelle Gunn-Hudson. "Through these interviews, each participant got the chance to practice articulating their work experience, improving their body language, and refining their tone of voice—skills that are crucial for securing employment. More importantly, they received personalized feedback on their performance, helping them understand their strengths and areas for improvement."
