1	MR. LUNSFORD: All right. Well, good
2	morning, everybody. I appreciate you being
3	here on a nice cool Mississippi morning.
4	We're going to go ahead and get on the
5	record. I want to say thanks to Nikki Lloyd
6	who's here as our court reporter. And so if
7	y'all will recall as part of Mississippi law,
8	this gathering needs to be either recorded
9	for audio purposes or transcribed, and so
10	we've decided today to have Ms. Lloyd present
11	who will be transcribing everything that is
12	said throughout today's meeting.
13	There will be a period of time when we
14	ask for questions, and as you know, Ms. Lloyd
15	I'm sure has a great memory, but we're going
16	to make sure we get it correct as to who
17	asked what question. If you're going to ask
18	a question, we'd ask that you identify
19	yourself and say your name and which
20	particular company that you're with today
21	before you ask the question. That would be
22	very helpful. And I'm sure somebody is going
23	to forget. This is common to us lawyers
24	because we do this in court all of the time.
25	But if somebody forgets, Ms. Lloyd, I'm sure,

1	is going to remind us to identify ourselves.
2	I know I met many of you coming in. My
3	name is Bill Lunsford. I'm an attorney with
4	the law firm of Butler Snow. And as just a
5	matter of background, our law firm was
6	retained sometime ago by the State of
7	Mississippi in order to write the Request for
8	Proposal that y'all have now received. And,
9	in fact, you probably saw our law firm's
10	name.
11	Obviously, I think it's pretty clear for
12	those of you around the table that I know
13	that have a lot of experience in this
14	industry that this is a first for the State
15	of Mississippi, and this indicates a
16	significant commitment by Governor Reeves and
17	by the Mississippi Department of Corrections
18	to seek a qualified, comprehensive healthcare
19	provider that can meet all of the needs of
20	the current incarcerated population.
21	Also with me, I just want to identify so
22	y'all know exactly the parties involved that
23	will be leading you through this particular
24	week. To my left is Ruth Naglich, who many
25	of you recall is the now retired, former

1	Health Services Associate Commissioner for
2	the Alabama Department of Corrections. She
3	was she is part of the Butler Snow team.
4	And as well as one of the staff members and
5	paralegals, Kristi Simpson. They're also
6	involved in the preparation and the process
7	for the law firm. I want to go ahead and
8	identify those individuals just so you know
9	who they are because we obviously have a
10	team. This was not a Request for Proposal
11	that was drafted by a single person in our
12	law firm. Moreover, let me say, this was a
13	collaborative between MDOC, others in state
14	government across the spectrum of leadership
15	inside Mississippi as well as our law firm.
16	And so the others in my law firm who are
17	involved in this include Matt Reeves, Anne
18	Adams Hill and Lynette Potter.
19	And so at this time, this will be my
20	primary involvement until we get to the
21	questions. Courtney Cockrell is here.
22	Courtney is Associate General Counsel
23	MS. COCKRELL: Deputy, Deputy General
24	Counsel.
25	MR. LUNSFORD: Deputy General Counsel

1	with the Mississippi Department of
2	Corrections, and she is going to lead us
3	through today's conference and will be
4	leading us through the questions as well.
5	So at this point, I'm going to turn it
6	over to Courtney. Thank you.
7	MS. COCKRELL: Good morning, everyone.
8	COLLECTIVELY: Good morning.
9	MS. COCKRELL: Just housekeeping,
10	obviously, we have coffee and water and I
11	think some juice in the back, so feel free to
12	partake as necessary.
13	I'm going to try to speak up, but if I
14	need to speak a little louder, please let me
15	know. And if I talk too fast, because I'm
16	going to do a lot of reading this morning, so
17	please let me know that as well.
18	All right. So the first thing we want
19	to do is the roll call. So consistent with
20	Section 4.4.2 of the Mississippi Department
21	of Corrections RFP No. 3120002800 for
22	Comprehensive Correctional Healthcare
23	Services, MDOC is holding a Pre-Proposal
24	Conference at 9:00 a.m. Central Standard Time
25	on this day, January 8th, 2024, at the

1	Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum
2	at 1150 Lakeland Drive in Jackson,
3	Mississippi 39216.
4	We begin today's conference with a roll
5	call of all attendees documented for the
6	court reporter.
7	When indicated, please state the
8	following: your name, the company you
9	represent, if you plan to attend the site
10	visits and the name of anyone from your
11	company who will attend the site visits but
12	not who's not present at the Pre-Proposal
13	Conference.
14	Please speak loudly and slowly to ensure
15	the court reporter can hear and transcribe
16	your information. We will start let's
17	start here (indicating) and just work our way
18	around.
19	MR. McNEIL: Good morning. My name is
20	Edward McNeil. Centurion Health. We will
21	also have April Meggs and Dr. Vanessa Bellamy
22	join us on the site tours.
23	MR. MAY: I'm Robert May with Centurion
24	Health, and I will not be on the site tours.
25	MR. HOWARD: I'm Greg Howard,

1	Mississippi Independent Hospital Corporation,
2	and I will be attending the site visits and I
3	have Richard Daughdrill with me.
4	MR. NATTANS: Good morning oh, do you
5	want to
6	MR. DAUGHDRILL: Unh-unh. He said it.
7	MR. NATTANS: Good morning. My name is
8	John Nattans. I'm with Correct RX Pharmacy,
9	and I will be attending the tours as well.
10	MS. INGRAM: I'm Martha Ingram, and I'm
11	with Wexford Health Sources. We have three
12	of us here, and I will be attending the site
13	visits.
14	MR. DOVER: Ken Dover, Wexford Health
15	Sources, and I will attend the site visits.
16	MR. BRITT: Paul Britt, Wexford Health,
17	and also attending the site visits.
18	MR. WANSLEY: We can probably go to the
19	other side.
20	MR. MILES: Curtis Miles, BosWell
21	Pharmacy Services. I'll attend the
22	conference tours.
23	MS. PHELPS: Ashley Phelps. I'm with
24	YesCare, and I will be attending the site
25	tours. We will also have Maria O'Neal

1	attending as well.
2	MR. LADELE: My name is Gregory Ladele.
3	I'm with YesCare, and I will be attending all
4	of the site tours.
5	MS. HOGUE: Good morning. Kathy Hogue
6	with Vital Core, and I will be attending the
7	site tours.
8	MS. SCHULT: Good morning. Deborah
9	Schult with Vital Core, and I'll be attending
10	the site tours.
11	MR. FLETCHER: Frank Fletcher with Vital
12	Core. I will be attending the site tours
13	today and tomorrow. I will not be attending
14	the site tour on Wednesday.
15	MS. COCKRELL: And if I can get the
16	other MDOC attorneys to introduce themselves,
17	please.
18	MR. VINCENT: My name is Leonard
19	Vincent.
20	MR. WANSLEY: Steven Wansley, senior
21	attorney, MDOC.
22	MS. COCKRELL: All right. Is there
23	anyone present who does not have a copy of
24	the agenda and access to the RFP?
25	All right. Consistent with Mississippi

1	Public Procurement Review Board Rule
2	3-202.07, a transcript of these proceedings
3	will be made public following the conference.
4	Both the agenda and the RFP will be appended
5	to the transcript of the Pre-Proposal
6	Conference.
7	So at this time, I'm just going to
8	officially welcome you. The Mississippi
9	Department of Corrections announces the
10	Request for Proposal to all eligible and
11	interested parties for the opportunity to
12	submit a proposal, in accordance with the
13	requirements herein, for management and
14	delivery of a comprehensive healthcare
15	program to all inmates in the care, custody
16	and control of the Mississippi Department of
17	Corrections at the facilities listed and
18	described in Appendix B of the RFP. You are
19	invited to submit a proposal in accordance
20	with the requirements specified in this RFP,
21	which are included in Section 5 of this RFP.
22	Inmate healthcare services include, but
23	are not limited to dental, pharmacy, medical,
24	mental health, institutional staffing and
25	management, utilization and claims

1	management, management of healthcare records,
2	chronic care, community provider network,
3	ambulance services, medical supplies and
4	equipment, medical biohazard waste removal,
5	diagnostic services, both on-site and
6	community-based treatments and procedures.
7	MDOC anticipates the selected bidder
8	will assume responsibility for providing the
9	delivery of healthcare services under this
10	RFP beginning at 12:01 a.m., Central Daylight
11	Time, October 1st, 2024. The selected bidder
12	will have basic systems and programs, as
13	outlined in Section 7 of this RFP, fully
14	implemented and operational within 180 days
15	of its provision of services under this
16	contract.
17	As stated in Section 4.4.2. of RFP No.
18	3120002800 for Comprehensive Correctional
19	Healthcare Services, MDOC established this
20	Pre-Proposal Conference for the purpose of
21	providing an opportunity for clarification of
22	any aspects of the RFP and establishing an
23	in-person setting in which bidders may ask
24	questions and receive additional information
25	through the engagement with MDOC leadership

1	so they are fully so they fully understand
2	MDOC's commitment to secure a qualified
3	healthcare service provider as a result of
4	this RFP.
5	In view of the limited facilities
6	available for a Pre-Proposal Conference,
7	bidders should limit their representation to
8	three individuals per bidder at the
9	Pre-Proposal Conference. And I thank y'all
10	for doing that.
11	The Pre-Proposal Conference is for
12	informational purposes only. Any question
13	any answers furnished during this
14	Pre-Proposal Conference will not be official
15	until they have been verified in writing by
16	MDOC. All questions and answers will be
17	posted to MDOC's website,
18	www.mdoc.ms.gov/general-public/procurement,
19	as an addendum to, and shall be made a part
20	of this RFP.
21	And just one additional, whenever I
22	receive an e-mail, I can't respond directly,
23	so that's why if you don't hear directly back
24	from me, I have to post it to the website and
25	to the portal, so I'm not ignoring your

1	e-mails.
2	Attendance at the Pre-Proposal
3	Conference is mandatory. Failure to attend
4	both the Pre-Proposal Conference and the
5	facility tours shall disqualify a bidder from
6	submitting a proposal in response to this
7	RFP. If a proposal is received from a bidder
8	after failing to participate in both the
9	Pre-Proposal Conference and the facility
10	tours, it will be returned to bidder
11	unopened.
12	Now I'm going to move to our Rules of
13	Engagement section. All right. Consistent
14	with Section 4.4.2 of this RFP, Mandatory
15	Pre-Proposal Conference, any answers
16	furnished during the Pre-Proposal Conference
17	will not be official, again, until they have
18	been verified in writing by MDOC. All
19	questions and answers will be posted to
20	MDOC's website as an addendum. Responses
21	presented at this conference are speculative
22	until you receive an official written
23	response.
24	MDOC serves as the issuing agency for
25	this RFP, though other agencies and

1	authorities within the State of Mississippi
2	also possess approval authority with respect
3	to any resulting contract. The sole point of
4	contact will be myself: Courtney Cockrell,
5	Deputy General Counsel, Mississippi
6	Department of Corrections. And I have a
7	specific e-mail address:
8	HealthcareRFP2023@mdoc.state.ms.us. And my
9	phone number is (601)359-5264. Again, that's
10	(601)359-5264, and that is my office number.
11	Any contact with MDOC's contact any
12	contact with MDOC's contact person shall be
13	in writing only. Any attempt to contact
14	MDOC's contact person regarding this
15	procurement in person or by telephone may be
16	grounds for disqualification per Section 4.2.
17	MDOC is not liable for any fees, costs
18	or other liabilities of any kind the bidder
19	incurs in preparation and submission of its
20	proposal, in participating in the RFP process
21	or in anticipation of the award of the
22	contract.
23	This RFP includes specific, important
24	instructions governing the content of the
25	requested proposals, including requirements

1	specific to information and material that
2	shall be included in such proposals, a
3	description of the services to be provided,
4	requirements that bidders must meet to be
5	eligible for consideration, general
6	evaluation criteria and other requirements
7	specific to this RFP.
8	MDOC seeks proposals from bidders who
9	currently possess the experience, expertise,
10	credentials, financial means, management
11	structure necess and management structure
12	necessary to provide comprehensive healthcare
13	services to the incarcerated population in
14	the custody of the Mississippi Department of
15	Corrections. In particular, it is the
16	expectation of MDOC that a bidder possesses
17	appropriate resources to recruit and retain
18	sufficient administrative, dental, medical
19	and mental health personnel, particularly
20	necessary licensed dental, medical, mental
21	health personnel in order to meet the
22	staffing requirements set forth herein. And
23	that's in Section 4.4.
24	Failure to attend the Pre-Proposal
25	Conference and the facility tours shall

1	disqualify a bidder from submitting a
2	proposal in response to this RFP. If a
3	proposal is received after failing to
4	participate in both the Pre-Proposal
5	Conference and the facility tours, it will be
6	returned unanswered.
7	MR. LUNSFORD: Attendance will be
8	confirmed.
9	MS. COCKRELL: Attendance will be
10	confirmed by sign-in sheets available at the
11	beginning of each facility tour.
12	Any questions regarding this RFP must be
13	submitted by e-mail with the subject line,
14	MDOC 2023 RFP Question again, that's, MDOC
15	2023 RFP Question to the Mississippi
16	Department of Corrections contact person no
17	later than 5:00 p.m., Central Standard Time,
18	on January 26th, 2024. Repeat that, 5:00
19	p.m., Central Standard Time, January 26th,
20	2024. MDOC shall post questions along with
21	the answers to the questions on MDOC's
22	website by February 16th, 2024.
23	MDOC reserves the right to forego
24	answering any questions received after the
25	deadline set forth above. In the event any
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1	bidder submits any question or answer after
2	the deadline set forth above and elects to
3	proceed with the submission of a proposal,
4	such bidder voluntarily and knowingly assumes
5	the risk that the proposal will not be
6	responsive or competitive due to their
7	failure to timely submit the question and/or
8	their failure to permit MDOC sufficient time
9	to review and answer the question untimely
10	submitted.
11	Now we're going to move to our bidder
12	section.
13	Questions? Do you have any questions so
14	far on all that information that I've given?
15	Yes, sir.
16	MR. MAY: Robert May with Centurion
17	Health. On the questions and answers, are
18	you going to do a rolling process? So if we
19	submit questions today, you might post them
20	today and answer them in time, or is it all
21	the way up to the due date and then we see
22	them after?
23	MR. LUNSFORD: So here's what will
24	happen in our view, which is if you look back
25	at the schedule let me direct you to the
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1	schedule in the RFP, which is included
2	MS. COCKRELL: Page 4.
3	MR. LUNSFORD: on Page 4. So to the
4	extent that any questions arise during the
5	course of today's prebid conference that we
6	do not answer, those will be posted at some
7	point in the future. Now, when that happens,
8	it may be in the next two weeks. It may be
9	in the next by the deadline for MDOC to
10	provide answers to questions. We can't agree
11	to a particular timeframe given that we don't
12	know what the questions would be. So that
13	will be done. And that's why we encourage
14	everyone to routinely, independently check
15	that website. There's language in the RFP
16	that I refer you to I'm not going to quote
17	it now in terms of your obligations to
18	routinely check the website and make sure
19	that you're up to date on that information.
20	MR. MAY: I just raise it
21	MR. LUNSFORD: Sure.
22	MR. MAY: maybe keep us from all
23	asking the same questions if they're kind of
24	posted or something as we go. We could all
25	look before we ask, see if it's already

1	asked. Not overload you with repetitive
2	questions.
3	MR. LUNSFORD: To the extent possible,
4	we will work to address any questions you all
5	raise during the next week. We will attempt
6	to address those prior to your deadline for
7	questions so that you can cross-reference
8	those and ensure for your purposes, because
9	we certainly don't want you to waste time
10	duplicating any questions, nor do we want to
11	have to go back and say, please refer to so
12	and so.
13	MR. MAY: Yes.
14	MS. COCKRELL: No other questions?
15	Okay. So consistent with Section 4.4.2
16	of the RFP, Mandatory Pre-Proposal
17	Conference, any answers furnished during the
18	Pre-Proposal Conference will not be official
19	until they have been verified in writing by
20	DOC. All questions and answers will be
21	posted to the website as an addendum to the
22	RFP. Responses presented at the conference
23	are speculative until official written
24	responses are provided.
25	We're now going to go through the RFP

1	page by page as well as the appendices in the
2	back, and I'll ask if there are any questions
3	for each page and just please let me know and
4	I can stop and we'll address them as such.
5	And also, again, you can just please
6	state your name and the company you
7	represent.
8	COURT REPORTER: Just make sure you
9	speak up. I'm having a little trouble
10	hearing over there.
11	MR. LUNSFORD: Okay.
12	COURT REPORTER: Thank you.
13	MS. COCKRELL: So let's see. You want
14	to start with the Introductory page?
15	MR. LUNSFORD: Yes.
16	MS. COCKRELL: So Introductory page is
17	Page 1. Does anybody need a copy? Okay.
18	Are there any questions on Page oh, sorry.
19	MR. HOWARD: I'll take a copy of this
20	one.
21	MS. COCKRELL: Sure.
22	MALE SPEAKER: I've got another taker
23	over here.
24	MR. HOWARD: If you've got one.
25	MS. SCHULT: I'll get one if you have

1	one more.
2	MS. COCKRELL: Okay. I'm going to start
3	with the Introduction page on Page 1.
4	Anybody have any questions regarding anything
5	on that page? Hearing none.
6	Page 2 is the Definition page. Any
7	questions on Page 2?
8	Okay. Moving on to Page 3. Seeing
9	none.
10	Any questions on Page 4?
11	Okay. Page 5?
12	Page 6?
13	Page 7?
14	Page 8?
15	Page 9?
16	MR. FLETCHER: Page 9.
17	MS. COCKRELL: Okay. Yes, sir.
18	MR. FLETCHER: Frank Fletcher with Vital
19	Core Health Strategies. I had a question on
20	the bottom of Page 8 and the top of Page 9
21	regarding Section 5.2.1 and 5.2.2. 5.2.1
22	says the external hard drive or thumb drive
23	containing the bidder's proposal should
24	clearly identify the bidder and include the
25	name, et cetera, et cetera. And then Section

1	5.2.2 says, the ten paper copies of the
2	proposal and external hard drive or thumb
3	drive required in this section shall not
4	include any identifying information to
5	include, but not limited to bidder's prior,
6	current or future company names or addresses,
7	et cetera, et cetera. And that's regarding
8	the blind scoring process in 5.2.2. So those
9	two sections seem to be contradictory. So I
10	guess my question really is, are you in fact
11	looking for a blind bid, because there are
12	other sections of the RFP that do require
13	identifying information?
14	MR. LUNSFORD: So just to be very clear,
15	the external hard drive should be marked. It
16	should not it should be marked with the
17	identifying information. Otherwise, it would
18	be impossible for us to track whose hard
19	drive that would be.
20	And I agree that there's probably some
21	clarification we can provide as to this. The
22	intention is for it to be a blind submission
23	process, and so we will review that
24	particular issue and provide further
25	clarification. That's a fair question.

1	We'll provide further clarification on that.
2	MR. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
3	MR. LUNSFORD: To the extent well,
4	I'll stop there, but we will provide further
5	clarification on that.
6	MR. FLETCHER: Okay. And if I may, just
7	to continue a little bit. If you look at, on
8	Page 95.6.1.1, requests the name of the
9	bidder excuse me the name of the
10	bidder. And, again, there are, I think, some
11	other areas of the RFP that are going to
12	require identifying information.
13	MR. LUNSFORD: Well, I think what we
14	need to clarify for you I'm not going to
15	provide the full clarification now, but I
16	think what word is being missed in 5.2.2 is
17	the word redacted, and so I believe that
18	information needs to be in there but the
19	manner in which it's submitted needs to be
20	redacted. And so we'll clarify that to
21	ensure that everyone has clear instructions.
22	MR. FLETCHER: Thank you.
23	MS. COCKRELL: Anybody else have a
24	question on Page 9?

12	MS. PHELPS: I have a question.
13	This is Ashley Phelps with YesCare.
14	7.8.8.11 and 7.8.8.12 talk about the
15	monitoring of acutely suicidal and
16	non-acutely suicidal inmates. It indicates
17	selected bidder will document any activities
18	on a routine basis throughout the period of
19	observation. Is the intent that the bidder
20	company will be responsible for the
21	observation, monitoring and documentation of
22	patients on suicide watch?
23	MR. LUNSFORD: Yes.
24	MS. PHELPS: Okay. Thank you.
25	MR. LUNSFORD: And that includes both

1	acutely suicidal incarcerated individuals in
2	7.8.811 and the non-acute, which is defined
3	further at 7.8.8.12.
4	MS. PHELPS: Okay. Thank you.
5	MS. COCKRELL: Any questions on 47?
6	48?

12	Mississippi Independent Hospital Corporation.
13	Can we ask general questions on the entire
14	section
15	MR. LUNSFORD: Sure.

18	section?
19	MR. LUNSFORD: That's up to you.
20	MR. HOWARD: So I don't expect you to
21	answer all of these questions today. Some of
22	it's detailed. But what's the bandwidth for
23	each facility you have for internet service?
24	MS. COCKRELL: We don't know that
25	offhand, but we

1	MR. HOWARD: That's all right.
2	MS. COCKRELL: that's a question we
3	will certainly
4	MR. HOWARD: The other one is, what is
5	your EHR provider?
6	MS. COCKRELL: That's another question
7	we will provide specifics on.
8	MR. HOWARD: And what version is it?
9	The other one is, you referenced imaging
10	storage, does MDOC currently have a PAC
11	system? If not or if so, what is it? If
12	not, does your EHR support integration of a
13	PAC system?
14	And the other last question I have
15	is, what major medical equipment is provided
16	by MDOC?
17	MR. LUNSFORD: All those questions
18	are we want to make sure that they're
19	comprehensive and complete, so
20	MR. HOWARD: Sure.
21	MR. LUNSFORD: we'll review those and
22	get back to you all in a written format.
23	MS. PHELPS: I have a question, but it
24	would be backed up to Page 50.
25	MR. LUNSFORD: That's okay.
1	

1	MS. PHELPS: And my apologies.
2	MR. LUNSFORD: That's okay.
3	MS. PHELPS: So this is the mental
4	health services and restricted housing.
5	7.8.17.4 indicates mental health services and
6	restricted housing for inmates not on the
7	mental health caseload. Right below that, it
8	says inmates on the mental health caseload.
9	I would think that would be on the mental
10	health caseload, but I wanted a clarification
11	since it's contradictory.
12	MR. LUNSFORD: So it may be an
13	organizational confusion because each of
14	those statements can be used independently.
15	There is some probably clarification there
16	and I think your question that as I
17	understand it, is what level of services will
18	be required for those individuals not on the
19	mental health caseload who are in restrictive
20	housing? And we can provide some further
21	clarification on that.
22	MS. PHELPS: Okay.
23	MR. LUNSFORD: I do see that as being a
24	gap there that we can fill for you all.
25	MS. PHELPS: 7.8.17.2, so above that

1	refers to in not on the mental health
2	caseload.
3	MR. LUNSFORD: Yep.
4	MS. PHELPS: Okay.
5	MR. LUNSFORD: I think well, we'll
6	clarify. I'm not sure what didn't happen
7	is actually, I think there's an
8	unnecessary duplicate there in 7.8.17.4, but
9	we'll clarify that. And I think what you
10	will we'll verify this, but I believe what
11	you'll see is a clarification of 7.8.17.4
12	with everything else remaining the same.
13	MS. PHELPS: Okay.
14	MR. LUNSFORD: Thank you for pointing
15	that out, though.
16	MS. COCKRELL: Okay. Think we were on
17	52. Any questions on Page 52?
